# ANT PROOFING YOUR PET'S FOOD BOWL.

As the temperature rises, a favourite destination for ants is often your pet's bowl. A simple way to keep them out of your dog or cat's food is to set your pet's bowl into a shallow pan of water. It is like creating a moat around the food bowl, preventing the ants from reaching your pet's food. Not only does it keep the ants out, but your pet can take a sip of water from the pan whenever they are thirsty.



#### FELINE LOWER URINARY TRACT DISEASES (FLUTD)

Both female and male cats can get FLUTD, which is really a group of feline diseases that have multiple causes. Cats that are overweight, unfit or who eat dry food often suffer from this disease. Stress is also a factor. The symptoms of FLUTD include straining to urinate, bloody urine, crying when urinating, depression, dehydration, lack of appetite, licking around the urinary area and vomiting. If your cat has a problem urinating, call us immediately as this situation is always an emergency. To diagnose this condition, we will conduct a complete physical exam, a urinalysis and may require a urine culture, blood work, radiographs, or ultrasound. Urinary problems are so varied, therefore there is not just one treatment. Your cat may require antibiotics, urinary acidifiers, surgery to remove bladder stones or a tumor, and so on. Failure to treat a urinary problem can quickly lead to kidney failure. It can prove fatal if an obstruction in the urinary tract is not relieved immediately. #### **EAR INFECTIONS**

Ear infections can almost drive your pet nuts. They may shake their heads or scratch their ears as their infection may be itchy or even painful. Often there is a discharge from the ears, or they may have a really bad odor. Other symptoms include a lack of balance, redness in the outer portion of the ear, and some swelling of the outer portion of the ear. Pets with long, floppy ears often have an infection at some stage of their lives. We can treat the infection with drops of antibiotics and proceed to clean the ear canal.
