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What is Periodontal Disease?

It is a disease in cats or dogs which is caused by a progressive bacterial disease that damages their gums, bone and other supporting tissue in their mouth. The disease lurks below the gums and can be hard notice until the disease is very advanced. Preventative dental care is vital for pets to avoid this nasty condition. A regular dental health check should be included in your pets annual check-up. A probing check of their teeth and gums plus an Xray evaluation taken under general anaesthesia will be necessary once a year. [Book Here](#). Symptoms of the disease include a bad breath, bleeding gums, loose teeth, or receded teeth. There are four stages of the disease with stage one being mild, to stage four being having a poor prognosis.

It's Spring & Ticks and Fleas are Back in Force!

These parasites latch onto pets and feed on the blood of mammals. They carry bacterial diseases such as Lyme disease that are harmful to dogs, cats (and humans)! **Please ensure that your pet has had their shots!** Check them after walking outside for both pests. Engorged ticks are easier to find as they are larger, but when removing them make sure you remove all parts of the tick. If you are not sure, bring them into us to check. Prevention is the best option, don't wait till disease from these parasites gets a hold as it can be harder and more expensive to treat than to prevent. [Click here](#) to book an appointment.

Diet Can Make or Break Your Pet.

Feeding your pet a high quality pet food that provides all the essential nutrients is more economical in the long run as it keeps them healthy and disease free. The first couple of ingredients should be some sort of meat, not a meat by-product or grain. Many cheaper foods have a high ratio of fillers and skimp on good protein. Pets also require a regular food schedule; adult dogs often require two meals a day, cats may require more. A regular meal time can help you to toilet train your pet as they usually have to go to the bathroom approx. 20– 30 minutes after eating. You can be prepared and get them to the bathroom or outdoors in time. Remember to give a ton of praise for getting it right—especially for a young animal as they thrive on your attention. Avoid giving your pet an excess amount of treats or 'people' food as it is not good for them. Provide plenty of water for drinking, especially in summer. If you are in doubt about what to feed your pet, call in to our clinic for a chat. We can suggest some things that will keep your cat or dog fit, healthy and full of energy.

Dog Etiquette in Public Areas. When taking your dog out in public areas, they must be restrained, well trained and polite to other dogs and people. A dog can cause injuries if they jump up or tangle themselves around the legs of young children or the elderly. Before you go out in public your dog needs to be leash trained, and they should obey the commands such as sit, down, stay and other commands that make it a pleasure to take them out with you. Allowing your dog a quick hello sniff with other dogs is fine, but move on promptly to prevent the leashes becoming entangled which is a safety risk for both animals. Your dog should come when called which is essential to maintain control over their behaviour ... you don't want to have to chase them which is frustrating and embarrassing. If there are any signs of aggression between dogs that meet, calmly remove your dog from the situation before it escalates. Remove any poop your dog makes, and always check before you go out that your dog will be welcome.

Snakes are protected under the Nature Conservation Act 1992. Please note — they cannot be killed or taken from the wild and to do so comes with severe penalties.

We all love spring, and snakes are no different. It is the mating season for them which means males snakes will be out and about to find a female partner for mating. When you see them, treat them with respect. Keep out of their way, keep your dog, cat and toddlers inside. Lock up your birds or hens so that they are safe. Keep your yard mowed, pick up stacks of iron or building offcuts, and don't let piles of rubbish build up around your house. Let them slide along through your property, but if they do linger, contact your local snake catcher to remove them safely. Get your local number now and put it up on the fridge with a magnet, you never know when you may need it. Spring and summer are the snakes most active months, so treat them with respect because they play an important role in maintaining the natural environment.

Itchy and Scratchy Pets!

Your beloved pet can nearly drive you mad with obsessive itching and scratching. Like humans, they can be allergic to things in the environment such as dust mites, pollen, mould, the saliva from another animal when licked, or even a product that has been used on their coat. Allergies can also stem from flea bites which can cause a lot of itching and skin discomfort. Food allergies can upset your cat or dog. If your pet is driving you crazy with their itching, if they have bald patches on their skin, red weepy sores or are generally not themselves, a seasonal skin allergy may be the cause. Tell tale signs include the itching, red or scabby skin lesions, hair loss, licking their paws obsessively, and an inability to sit still and relax. Before it gets too bad, schedule a visit to our clinic so we can confirm a diagnose and provide home treatments to help manage this issue.
